



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UNIVERSITY OF RAJASTHAN: At A GLANCE

Established on January 8, 1947, as Rajputana University, the University of Rajasthan proudly holds the title of the oldest institution of higher learning in Rajasthan. From its inception, it has been recognised under sections 2f and 12B of the UGC Act, symbolising its commitment to quality education. Situated in an urban setting, the Central Campus spans a vast 338.14 acres, while the satellite campus, housing Constituent Colleges, extends over 138.21 acres. Initially having jurisdiction over the entire state, the University's reach has now been focused on Jaipur and Dausa districts, with a network of 636 affiliated colleges.

The University owes much to the foresight, ability and sincerity of the first three Vice-Chancellors of the University viz. Dr. G.S. Mahajani, Dr. G.C. Chatterji and Dr. Mohan Singh Mehta, who played a crucial role in the development of the University, its campus, recruitment of faculty and in laying down sound traditions. Each of the three distinguished and highly dignified Vice-Chancellors served the University for two successive terms, thus, guiding the destiny of the University for the first eighteen years, which was the formative period of the University. To them the University owes the image it came to acquire in the minds of the intellectual community of India. They brought in different faculties, some of the finest scholars who after having served in the University for many years, took up high positions at the national level. The names of Prof. M. V.  - ◆ Organisation of Faculty Induction Programme/Faculty Development Programme, Refresher Courses, Workshops on Curriculum Development and Examination Reforms.

 - ♦ There is a provision of reservation for SC, ST, OBC, MBC, EWS and differently abled groups and any other as per State Government rules.

 - ♦ The integration of community and national engagement through Centre for lifelong learning initiatives, centre for physics education, environmental studies, NSS, NCC and promotion of sustainable practices and value orientation, fosters holistic development and inclusion.
- **ICT Based Education**
 - ♦ Provision of computer education at the Undergraduate level, usage of ICT tools in teaching, learning and evaluation.
 - ♦ Provision for ICT-related and oriented courses M.Tech., MCA, M.Sc. (IT), PGDCA, BCA, etc. for other disciplines.
 - ♦ Training in both basic and advanced skills in computer usage and applications.
 - ♦ Computerisation of library, examination work, and database management.
 - ♦ INFLIBNET and other ICT facilities are available in the Campus-wide area network through Infonet Centre.
 - ♦ Emphasis on Open-Source Technology for application development.
 - ♦ Computer Labs, Research Centres, and provision of computers in all the sections of administration and academics.
- **Global Demand**
 - ♦ University offers globally relevant PG programmes and research courses. e.g. Science & Technology, Computer Science, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Converging Technologies, Social Sciences, Arts, Fine Arts, Commerce and Management, Law, Education and Women's Studies
 - ♦ Geo-Informatics, Mineral Processing, Instrumentation Technology, Material Science, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Journalism etc. are also offered.
 - ♦ The institution emphasizes training and development programs that enhance practical abilities and human resource skills, equipping individuals with the global competencies needed to thrive in the global world.



SOME OF THE DISTINCTIVE FEATURES OF THE UNIVERSITY ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- **Faculties, Departments, Colleges and Research Centres:**

- ♦ 9 Faculties, 35 Departments, 7 Constituent Colleges, 19 Research Centres.
- ♦ Recognition: Recognized under sections 2f and 12B of the UGC Act.

- ♦ **Accreditations:**

- o The University of Rajasthan has been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with an impressive track record. It was awarded an A+ Grade in the first cycle and an A Grade in the second cycle. Currently, the University is preparing for its Third Cycle of NAAC Accreditation, demonstrating its commitment to continuous improvement and excellence.
- o UGC recognized the University of Rajasthan among the top 15 Indian Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE).
- o University of Rajasthan, Jaipur has been made the Lead Knowledge Institution (LKI) for Rajasthan Under State Support of NITI Aayog, Govt. of India (RITI) to act as a key Knowledge partner.
- o University of Rajasthan is the first state University to be awarded ISO 21001:2018, ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 14001:2015 certificates. This achievement is a milestone in higher education. Along with this, IQAC has been instrumental in taking the initiative of getting the green audit, energy audit, academic and administration audit done in the University.

- ♦ **Financial Grants for Research Innovation and Infrastructure:**

- o Financial Grants for Research Innovation and Development: University of Rajasthan has been the recipient of numerous significant grants aimed at enhancing research, infrastructure, and academic quality.
- o Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA): The Ministry of Education and Government of Rajasthan have approved multiple grants under the RUSA program. Notably, the University received Rs. 35 Crores for research innovation and Rs. 07 Crores for HRDC Building and conduction of Faculty Improvement Programmes.
- o The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has sanctioned a grant of Rs. 22.89 Lakhs towards the State Centre of Excellence for Nutrition (SCOE) to Home Science Department.
- o Ministry of Education (MoE), New Delhi has sanctioned Rs. 10 Crores to the University to establish the Design Innovation Centre (DIC) at CCT. BIRAC, New Delhi has provided financial support of Rs. 2.2 Crores to establish University Innovation Cluster (UIC) programme in Biotechnology. This centre is also running at CCT.
- o The state government has approved financial support of Rs. 13 Crores through DST, Rajasthan for the establishment of the Centre for Excellence in Nanotechnology.
- o One of the young scientists Mr. Madhusudan Murthi who is currently working in the UIC programme has received financial support of Rs. 50 Lacs from DST, New Delhi to establish two start-up companies in the field of Biotechnology. He also received the best start-up award of Rs. 20 thousand in the International Knowledge Millennium Conference (IKMC-2019) held in Chennai.
- o University with Potential for Excellence (UPE): UGC recognized the University of Rajasthan among the top 15 Indian Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE) in 2012. A grant of Rs. 50 Crore was sanctioned for the enhancement of academic & research activities.
- o Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE): The Department of Science and Technology, Government of India has recognized the University of Rajasthan under its Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE) programme. The h-index of the University at the time of sanction was around 50 and hence a grant of Rs. 32.4 Crore has been sanctioned to the University for the Scientific Research and Development.
- o Ministry of Education (Formerly MHRD), Government of India & Government of Rajasthan sanctioned Rs. 20.00 Crores as an Infrastructure grant under the Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA.1.0) and 50.00 Crores (RUSA.2.0) for Infrastructure and research and Development.

- o Four out of the seven constituent Colleges have been accorded College with Potential Excellence (CPE) status.
- ♦ **Research Funding:**
 - o Research funding is received from various national and International agencies like UGC, DST, DBT, ICSSR, ICHR, ICAR, UNICEF, BIRAC, and CSIR enabling the university to do quality research.
 - o Other research facilities: USIC, CNCER, Herbarium, Animal House Center For Development of Physics Education, E-YUVA Center and Entrepreneurship and Career Hub, Department of Life Long Learning
- ♦ **Patents, Start-ups and MoUs:**
 - o University has received 7 patents in the session 2023-24.
 - o 20 startups registered in the session 2023-24.
 - o 48 MoUs in last five years.
 - o MoU with Rajasthan Centre for Advance Technology (RCAT), Government of Rajasthan and Dola Foundation for Skill Enhancement Courses for UG & PG students specially for skill building.
- **Academic Programs:**
 - ♦ **CGPA Grading:** Semester pattern and CGPA grading system introduced at UG & PG levels.
 - ♦ **NEP 2020:** The University introduced UGC four-year curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in Arts, Commerce, Fine Arts, Science and Social Science faculties.
 - ♦ **Entrance Exams:** Admission to Postgraduate program is through entrance exam (except for a few) and Ph.D. programs entrance is as per UGC guidelines.
 - ♦ University has special emphasis on course work in Ph.D. programs.
- **Student Achievements and Placements:**
 - ♦ **Examination Success:**
 - o Students clearing prestigious examinations like, UPSC, RPSC, UGC NET, CAT, RJS and Rajasthan Statistical Service and others.
 - ♦ **Placements:**
 - o Pass-out students from the Post Graduate Programme have been joining prestigious institutes like BARC, TIFR, PRL, NPL, DRDO, CDRI, IITs, IUAC, IUCAA, UGC-DAE CSR, NPL, NCL, ICS and RAS. Regular Placement fairs are organised by the university and students are given job opportunities at regular basis.

 - o University promotes gender equity and there is a constant rise in the number of admissions from marginalised sections.

 - ♦ Medal in Olympics - Ms. Anuya Prasad won air pistol Gold Medal in World Deaf Championship-2024.

 - ♦ Daycare Centre has been functioning for more than 25 years. Home away from home facility for parents.(students and faculty)
 - ♦ Campus Nursery School was established in the year 1964 in University Campus by a non-profitable society called Campus School Society with a vision to provide pre-primary education to children. It also extends its services as the lab school to the Dept. of Home Science of the University.
- **Notable Events:**
 - ♦ Convocation Ceremony: On May 15, 2025, the 34th Convocation Ceremony of University of Rajasthan took place at the Rajasthan International Centre (RIC). The ceremony was attended by the Honourable Governor Shri Haribhau Bagde, Vidhan Sabha Speaker Shri Vasudev Devnani, Member of Parliament Shri Arun Singh, Deputy Chief Minister Dr. Premchand Bairwa, and Vice-Chancellor Prof. Alpana Kateja. During the ceremony, a total of 150287 degrees were awarded, including 124 gold medals and 309 Ph.D degrees. The degrees and gold medals to the achievers were conferred by the honourable Governor during the convocation.
 - ♦ The 79th Foundation Day program of the University of Rajasthan was celebrated on 8th January, 2025. Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Govt. of India and Dr. Gauri Shankar Gupta (Retd.) Former Ambassador and High Commissioner of India graced the occasion.

Anti Ragging

Punishment Provisions

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging on campus or off campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

- Debarring from appearing in any sessional test/university examination or withholding results
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges withdrawing scholarships and other benefits
Suspension from the college for a period of one month Cancellation of admission Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- Fine up to twenty-five thousand rupees
- Imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees or with both
- Collective punishment - When the students committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggars. Ragging is defined as any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written or by an act, that has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student. Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activity that causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in a fresher or junior student. Asking the students to do any act or perform something that such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or junior student. This can lead to adverse effects such as depression, anxiety, and sometimes even suicide. We have a zero-tolerance policy at the University that commits to the fact that no act of ragging, major or minor, shall go unnoticed. No raggar, regardless of their gender, student or non-student, shall go unpunished

Complaints and Redressal

Any incident of ragging should be promptly reported to the Central Anti-Ragging Committee or Students Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) constituted by the University to address such matters. Adequate measures to prevent ragging would be taken by the administration acting under the anti-ragging Regulations and the perpetrators will be duly punished for incidents of ragging which are liable to the penalties and punishments as per the provisions of the Regulations.

Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place

WHAT IS SEXUAL HARASSMENT?

- (i) An unwanted conduct with sexual undertones if it occurs or which is persistent and which demeans, humiliates or creates a hostile and intimidating environment or is calculated to induce submission by actual or threatened adverse consequences and includes any one or more or all of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (whether directly or by implication), namely:
- any unwelcome physical, verbal or non verbal conduct of sexual nature
 - demand or request for sexual favours
 - making sexually coloured remarks
 - physical contact and advances
 - showing pornography & quot
- (ii) any one (or more than one or all) of the following circumstances, if it occurs or is present in relation or connected with any behaviour that has explicit or implicit sexual undertones-
- implied or explicit promise of preferential treatment as quid pro quo for sexual favours
 - implied or explicit threat of detrimental treatment in the conduct of work
 - implied or explicit threat about the present or future status of the person concerned
 - creating an intimidating offensive or hostile learning environment
 - humiliating treatment likely to affect the health, safety dignity or physical integrity of the person concerned
- Complaints.

Redressal

Any incident of sexual harassment should be promptly reported to the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), Centre for Women's Study constituted by the University to address such matters. Adequate measures to prevent any such act of harassment would be taken by the administration acting under the Regulations and the perpetrators will be duly punished for any such incidents of harassment which are liable to the penalties and punishments as per the provisions of the Regulations.

Key administrative positions are also held by prominent individuals, such as Shri K.C. Meena, who is the Chairman of the Rajasthan Public Service Commission, and Dr. O.P. Bairwa, who serves as the Commissioner of College Education. In the legislative domain, there is at least 10% representation in all Vidhan Sabhas across the state. At the national level, individuals are actively serving in prestigious services such as the Indian Administrative Service (IAS), Indian Police Service (IPS), Indian Economic Service (IES), Indian Statistical Service (ISS), and Indian Revenue Service (IRS). At the state level, representation continues through the Rajasthan Administrative Service (RAS) and the Rajasthan Accounts Service, reflecting a strong presence across various branches of governance.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell at the University of Rajasthan is a vibrant platform dedicated to ensuring the successful transition of students from academia to the professional world. With a rich history of placements across various disciplines, the University boasts an impressive track record of student achievements in diverse sectors.

Students have excelled with placements in prestigious positions such as RAS, School Lecturer, College Lecturer, Sub Inspector, Assistant Professor, PGT, Scientist at NIPGR, and ACG & FRO Grade-I. Students have been selected in UPSC and State Public Services Commissions.

Students have a strong track record of qualifying for NET/GATE exams, with many pursuing Ph.D.s in prestigious national research institutes. They have also succeeded in national-level tests for placements in organisations such as ONGC, NTPC, ISRO, and more. Students have found placements in government institutions, RPSC Assistant Professor roles, and organisations like DRDO and ISRO. The University's alumni are working as professors, counselors, dietitians, and in NGOs such as UNICEF.

In the field of Law, students have been selected for various positions such as Assistant Professors in RPSC and R.J.S., while others have joined advocacy at various courts including the Rajasthan High Court. AANANDAM PROGRAMME

From the academic session 2020-21 onward, Aanandam has been implemented in the curriculum of all annual UG/PG degree programmes and as a compulsory 2 Credit Course in each semester of all PG semester scheme programmes. 2023-24 onwards, Aanandam is available in the new UG semester scheme curriculum as a 2 credit Value Added Course in all UG Semester Scheme programmes. According to the mandate of NEP-2020, as a community engagement course, Aanandam aims to sensitise the students towards challenges and issues prevalent today in society and to instil the joy of giving in young citizens. The course has been implemented in all University teaching departments/centers, constituent colleges and affiliated colleges of the University of Rajasthan to make students aware about their role and responsibilities towards the society. During the year/semester, students are required to record acts of goodness daily in the Aanandam Diary and get engaged in individual and group community service activities. Every month, with active participation of students the 'Aanandam Day' is celebrated in the teaching units and motivational lectures/movies/webinars/interactive sessions are organised. Guidelines for the implementation of 'Aanandam' and the details of the evaluation and marking scheme are available on University website. The syllabus of Aanandam is centered around activities promoting goodness, which students engage in both individually and in groups. For group activities the students are required to take up projects outside College/University hours with NGOs/ Govt./social service organisations. Individual and group activities are suggested/approved and monitored by mentors allotted by their college/department.

RULES FOR EXEMPTION /PARTIAL EXEMPTION FOR PAYMENT OF TUITION AND/OR OTHER FEE

- No Tuition fee will be charged from the women students studying in the University Departments and Constituent Colleges for all types of courses including technical education but excluding self-financing courses run by the University.
- Students whose parents/guardians are non-income tax payers and who belong to scheduled castes/scheduled tribes, other backward classes and special backwards classes and also students who are wards of non-income tax payer ex-army men are exempted from payment of tuition fee except in the case of Department of European Languages.
- A student who is the ward of a defence personnel (or who himself is an ex-defence personnel) who was either permanently disabled or killed during
 - NEFA/LADDAKH operation of 1962 or
 - Indo-Pak War of 1971 shall be exempted from payment of tuition fee, examination fee and hostel room rent, provided that:
 - the family is now permanently settled in Rajasthan,

(b) the family is not in receipt of a pension exceeding Rs. 400/- p.m. and

(c) the student submits in duplicate a certificate from the Commanding Officer of the Unit concerned under the Seal of his office in the proforma

- A student who is orthopaedically handicapped shall be exempted from payment of tuition fee and examination fee provided he produces a certificate to that effect signed by a doctor not below the rank of a Junior Specialist and countersigned by the Principal Medical Officer that the candidate is permanently/partially disabled person.
- Visually and hearing impaired candidates will be exempted from payment of the examination & tuition fee.
 - Visually impaired students who are admitted to Post-Graduate courses in the University Teaching Departments will be exempted from payment of Tuition Fee, Library Caution Money, Laboratory Caution Money, Laboratory Fee, Library Fee, Games Fee, Publication Fee, Students Aid Fund Fee, Non-Resident Students Centre Fee, but if a blind student resides in a Hostel, all Hostel Fees will be charged.
- No tuition fee will be charged from the wards of Martyr (Martyr should be permanently domicile of Rajasthan) studying in the University Departments and constituent Colleges for all typed courses including technical educations but excluding self financing courses run by the University.

Notes:

- Laboratory Fee will be charged from all Students of the Science Faculty, and students in the Departments of Anthropology, Geography, Psychology and Statistics of the Faculty of Social Sciences and students in the Departments of Music and Drawing & Painting.
- Laboratory Caution Money deposit will be charged from all students from whom laboratory fee is realized.
- Where **parking** is provided, a **fee of Rs. 145.00** per annum will be charged from every student.
- Publication Charge/Fee will be only in such Departments/Colleges where such facilities are available.
- Any other fees not specified here shall not be charged unless prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor has been obtained.
- All deposits will be forfeited if not withdrawn within three academic sessions after leaving College/

- University.
7. Students of P.G. Diploma Course in Indian Culture will be required to pay Rs. 730/- as tuition fee if they are regular students of a Post-graduate course in the University.
 8. The Departments may not accept tuition fee from the hostllers for the II term unless they produce a 'No Dues Certificate' from the Warden concerned. A list of such hostllers shall be sent by the Resident Wardens to the Directors/Heads of the Department in advance.
 9. It is compulsory for all students to fill and deposit the **"Group Insurance Form"** as directed by the Dean Students Welfare Office.

Reservation Policy

1. Reservation of seats/relaxation of marks for S.C., S.T., OBC, MBC, Economically Weaker Sections, and Physically Handicapped Candidates: will be as per the policy of Government of Rajasthan.
 - (A) 49% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre-Professional, Certificate/Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each College/Department for NATURAL BORN sons/ daughters of parents belonging to Scheduled Castes (16%), Scheduled Tribes (12%), OBC except creamy layer (21%)
 - (B) 5% of the total number of seats in each category and each course in the Faculties specified in (A) above will be reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates defined as Deaf/ Dumb/Blind/Loss of any limb with permanent disability. As per reservation policy of the Government of Rajasthan.
 - (C) 10% of the total number of seats in each category and each course in the Faculties specified in (A) above will be reserved for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
 - (D) (i) All Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, MBC, EWS and OBC candidates who have passed the qualifying examination for admission to a University course may be arranged in order of merit within the category to which they belong.
 - (ii) Those who have secured marks above the level upto which the general category students are admitted, they should not be counted towards reserved quota at all and should be included in the General Merit List of admissions.
 - (iii) Excluding those admitted on merit along with general candidates as at (ii) above, other Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe candidates should be admitted in the order of merit going down the inter-se-merit list upto the point necessary to secure adequate number of candidates to Schedule Castes, Schedule Tribes to fulfill the reservation percentage completely
 - (iv) It is clarified that in order to fill the reservation quota for SC, ST, OBC, EWS and MBC candidates, there should be no hesitation to go down, if necessary, to the pass percentage of the qualifying examination (e.g. class XII, for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA Pass Course as well as Honours Part I and Bachelor's Degree for admission to a Post Graduate course, and so on).
 - (E) 5% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre- Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each College/ Department for the Most Backward Classes as per policy laid down by the Government of Rajasthan vide letter no. F-18(2) Education-4/2014 Reservation dated 07 March, 2019.
 - (F) 10% of the total number of seats in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre-Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) will be reserved in each College/ Department for the Economically Weaker Sections as per policy laid by Government of Rajasthan vide letter no. F-18(2) Education-4/2014 Reservation dated 07 March, 2019. There is no provision of relaxation

in eligibility criteria for EWS Candidates.

- (G) 15% supernumerary seats in all courses will be reserved for International Students including Persons of Indian Origin. Out of the 15% supernumerary seats 1/3rd i.e. 5% seats would be preferably filled by children of NRIs, on payment of five times the fee payable by a regular student of the same course.
- (H) For Transgender, Outright Admission may be given in each course in the Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts, Law, Social Sciences, Science, Commerce, Management Studies and Education (including Honours, Pre-Professional, Certificate/ Diploma Course, if any, in all these Faculties) subject to submission of a Government Certificate from the competent authority approved as per the latest directives for admission of transgender person in higher education.

Note:

- (i) Candidates belonging to S.C., S.T. and OBC, MBC, EWS category will be required to produce a certificate to that effect from a District Magistrate/ Tehsildar/ Sub- Divisional Magistrate, without which their cases will not be considered under the provision O.81-II, and as per directions of the State Government. Validity of One Year Certificates will be as per rules of the Government of Rajasthan. For Most Backward Classes and Economically Weaker Sections the validity of Certificates will be as per the Government of Rajasthan
- (ii) Candidates claiming concession under clause (B) above shall be required to furnish a certificate in original from the Principal S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur / Director, Rehabilitation Research Centre / Head of the Department concerned of S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.
- (iii) A relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum percentage of marks for admission under the provision (B) shall be admissible to Physically Handicapped candidates defined as deaf/ dumb/blind/loss of any limb with permanent disability. Such cases will be screened and cleared by a Central Committee constituted for this purpose. No other concession or weightage of marks on any other score whatsoever shall however, be admissible to them.

Ordinance 81-D Provision for Admission to Victims of Jaipur Serial Bomb Blast

0.81 D

- (i) The victims would be allowed outright admissions in any course which is run by the University of Rajasthan, provided they fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria for admission in the concerned department/constituent/ affiliated colleges/S.F.S. Courses, however, admission in the courses which are made through entrance tests, the aspirant student will have to appear in the said entrance exam, but no examination fee should be charged from the student to appear in the entrance exam.
- (ii) Every such Student will have to produce a certificate in this effect from, District Collector/Nagar Nigam or Medical Jurist of the SMS Hospital, Jaipur
- (iii) These Students would be exempted to pay the examination and other prescribed fee till they complete the courses of Study in the University of Rajasthan.
- (iv) Such students who have lost their shelter should be allowed to admission in the University hostel on the Priority basis without charging any fee.
- (v) A Separate committee which must include of University Medical officer, D.S.W Chief wardens (Boys and Girls) constitute by the Vice-Chancellor to scrutinise all the credentials in this regard before allowing above suggested relief to the victims
- One Seat shall be reserved for such students in all Affiliated/Constituted College and Deptt. of the University including S.F.S. Courses. The Seat is above of the Existing allotted Seat to the College/Deptt.
- “This special scheme must be applicable exclusively for two type of the victims-:”
- (A) Such aspirant students who have lost his/her parents. (Either father, mother, or any such person who was officially designated as guardian of such before this blast)
- (B) Any such parent of the aspirant student, who has been injured severely (minimum body injuries limit is 25%) or lost any vital body organ (partially or completely)

O-81-III Concessions for Purposes of Admission

- (i) Weightage of marks will be given while preparing the merit list only if the candidates has secured the minimum percentage of marks prescribed, if any for admission to the courses;
- (ii) Achievement in N.C.C. and Scouting/ Roving at the school level are valid only for under-graduate admissions and those at the college level for postgraduate/Law admissions, only once;
- (iii) The concession of marks under the various clauses of this ordinance will be given to a candidate to his/her advantage under any one of the clauses and not under more than one clause;
- (iv) The above concessions shall also be admissible to candidates seeking provisional admission (Supplementary candidates) under the provisions of O.198;
- (v) For the purpose of this ordinance only Sports Board, University of Rajasthan sports/games shall be recognised. Certified copies of Certificates should be attached to the application form for admission and shall not be entertained subsequently;
- (vi) If a student who has been given admission on the basis of concession as mentioned above does not appear on the College/University play grounds/courts for a regular practice, his admission may be cancelled at the discretion of the Head of the Institution concerned.
- (vii) In the interest of the Institution, the Head of the institution may refuse the above concessions. He may also refuse admission if he is doubtful about the authenticity of the certificate and or about the candidate's conduct.
- (viii) Claiming for 5% and above weightage in sports for U.G. and PG admission. Students have to report at University Sports Board for his skill performance and physical efficiency test in proper sports kit with original certificates.
- (ix) The weightage (Sports, NSS, NCC etc) should be added in the U.G % and then the 30% should be calculated for the (70+30) calculation.
- (x) Achievement in N.C.C. and Scouting/Roving at the school level are valid only for under-graduate admissions and those at the college level for postgraduate/Law admissions, only once.

Ordinance 81-IV

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Ordinances prescribing minimum percentage of marks for admission to the various courses of study, the Head of an Institution may fix a higher minimum percentage of marks "for students other than those belonging to SC/ST category" for regulating admission in the college concerned. Provided that a relaxation of 5% in the minimum percentage of marks prescribed for admission under the above provisions shall be admissible to Physically Handicapped candidates defined as deaf/ dumb/ blind/loss of any limb with permanent disability. No other concession or weightage in marks on any other score whatsoever shall, however, be admissible to them.

The Following Concessions shall be admissible to the outstanding players and athletes seeking admission to the various courses of study in the Faculties of Arts, Commerce, Education, fine Arts, Law, Management, Science and social Sciences.

- A. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for admission to a course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination(s) provided they fulfill the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances:
- i. Those who have been sponsored by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare to represent the Nation in Games & Sports in International Tournaments.
 - ii. Those who have been sponsored by the Inter University Sports Board to represent the Indian Universities in Games and sports in World University Games/tournaments.
 - iii. Those who have been members of the University of Rajasthan teams in games and sports which have been declared **First, Second and Third Position** in the All India Inter University tournaments under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
 - iv. Those who have represented the state school in games and sports in School Games Federation of India (SGFI).
- B. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 7% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course. Those who have represented the University in games and sports in the **All India Inter University** Tournaments held under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
- i. Winner/Runners-up in the West Zone Inter University Tournaments.
 - ii. Position in Kenderia Vidhyalaya Sangathan (K.V.S.)/ National/ Navodya Vidhyalaya Sangathan (N.V.S.)/ National/ IPS National Tournament/Sainik School National Tournaments.
 - iii. Position in Rajasthan state School Games Tournaments.
- C. The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 5% of the total aggregate of the marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list. This weightage will also be taken into consideration towards the fulfillment of the minimum requirement for admission prescribed, if any by the Head of an Institution under the provisions of O82-IV of the University Handbook Part-II.
- i. Those who have represented the University in games and sports in the Inter **University (zone)** Tournaments held under the auspices of the Association of Indian Universities.
 - ii. Participation in Kenderia Vidhyalaya Sangathan (K.V.S.)/National/Navodya Vidhyalaya Sangathan

- (N.V.S.) National/ IPS National/ CBSE National/ Sainik School National Tournament.
- iii. Participation in Rajasthan School State Games Tournaments.
 - iv. Position in CBSE Zonal/Cluster Tournaments
- (D) The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 4% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course.
- i. Position in KVS Regional/ Position in NVS Regional/ Position in IPS Regional or Cluster/Position in Rajasthan School District Tournaments.
 - ii. Position in Inter Colleges tournament organised by University Sports Board.
 - iii. Position in the All India Sanskrit Inter University tournaments.
- (E) The following categories of candidates shall be eligible for a weightage of 2% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the merit list for admission to a course.
- i. Those who have represented their respective schools in KVS Regional/ NVS cluster/ Regional/IPS Regional, Cluster/ Rajasthan District schools Tournaments.
 - ii. Those who have represented their respective colleges in games and sports at the Inter - Collegiate tournaments held under the auspices of the University Sports Board.

NOTE :

1. The weightage of the achievements at School level will be given only at Graduate Courses admission.
2. For PG admissions the weightage will be only given for the achievements during the graduation courses.
3. Weightage will be given to only those certificates of games & sports which he/she have participated at least once in the immediately preceding two years.
4. For the purpose of claiming the above concessions. The certificates submitted have to be countersigned by the Head of the Institution.
5. For the purpose of claiming the above weightage, the applicant has to submit School/College and such other relevant certificates(s) to prove the link of his representation upto that level.
6. The weightage will be given only for those games & Sports, which are approved in Sports Board, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

Weightage will not be given to any open competitions like district/ State/ National, Women sports, Rajiv Gandhi Khel Abhiyan, Rural Sports, PYAKA etc.

Co-Curricular Activities (National Jamboori/NSS/ Army)

1. **Following candidates shall be eligible for admission to the course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination provided they fulfill the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances:**
 - (i) Candidates sponsored by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India to represent the Nation in Co-curricular activities at the International level at least once in the immediately preceding two years.
 - (ii) The volunteers who are awarded with National Service Scheme National Award.
2. **A weightage of 4% will be given to those:** Who have completed 240 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years along with participation, at least once, in any National level camp i.e. Republic Day Parade Camp(Delhi) National Youth Festival/ National Integration Camp/Adventure Camp/ Pravasi Bhartiya Divas.
3. **A weightage of 3% will be given to those:** Who have completed 240 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years along with participation in any State level/ Mega camp.
4. **A weightage of 2.5% will be given to those:** Who have completed 240 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years along with one special camp.
5. **A weightage of 2.0% will be given to those:** Who have completed 240 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years.
6. **A weightage of 1.5% will be given to those:** Who have completed 120 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years along with one special camp.
7. **A weightage of 1.0% will be given to those:** Who have completed 120 hours of service in the immediately preceding two years.
8. Wards of Sahid (शहीद) Military and Paramilitary forces (B.S.F., CRPT, SSB, ITBP, CISF) will be given outright admission

NCC

- (A) (i) N.C.C. Cadets representing the Nation in any activity sponsored by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare/ Defence/ D.G., N.C.C. Delhi, shall be eligible for admission to the course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination, provided they fulfill the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances.
- (ii) All India Best Cadet Award (Girls/Boys) Army, Navy, Air Force, S.D., J.D. will be eligible for outright

admission as per the above clause.

- (B) Weightage of 5% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to those N.C.C. cadets who have completed one or more of the following :
 - (a) R.D. Camp/TSC/VSC/NSC (Note: 1% marks over and above the 5% marks will be given to those cadets getting 1st and 2nd prizes in any event at the R.D. Camp/TSC/VSC/NSC)

 - (c) Para Jumping Course (Note: 1% marks over and above the 5% marks will be given to those cadets completing the Sky Diving Course).

Cadets completing the Adventure Mountaineering and Advanced Mountaineering Course).

 - (h) A cadet who has achieved the rank of U.O./C.U.O/ Cadet Captain.

 - (k) Participation in competitions/activities held after selection by the Group Commander and organised under the auspices of N.C.C. Directorate, Rajasthan.
 - (l) A cadet who has achieved a Cadets Sergeant's/ Leading Cadet/Sergeant rank.

Scouts/ Guides / Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides

- (i) The following categories of Scouts/ Guides/Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides shall be eligible for admission to a course irrespective of the marks obtained by them at the qualifying examination provided they fulfill the conditions of eligibility laid down in other Ordinances:
 - (a) Those who have been sponsored by the National

- Headquarters, Bharat Scouts & Guides to represent in International events at least once in the immediately preceding five year. This privilege will be given to those who have been regular members of the Crew/Team for the Last three years.
- (b) Those who have been awarded President's Scout/Guide Certificate or President's Rover/Ranger Award by the President of India in the immediately preceding five years.
- (ii) The following categories of Scouts/ Guides/ Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides shall be eligible for a Weightage of 5% of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination while preparing the Merit List. This weightage will also be taken into consideration towards the fulfillment of minimum requirement for admission prescribed, if any, by the Head of an Institution under the provisions of 0.81-IV of the University Handbook Part II:
 "Those who have been sponsored by the State Headquarters, Bharat Scouts and Guides in National Events at least once in the immediately preceding five years. This privilege will be given to only those who have been regular members of the Crew/Team for the last four years i.e. Rover/Ranger Samagam."
- (iii) A weightage of 3% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the Scouts/Guides/Rover Scouts/Ranger Guides of the following categories:
- (a) Those who have been awarded Rajya Puruskar/Nipun certificate by the Governor/ State Chief Commissioner in the immediately preceding five years..
- (b) Those who have attended the Rover Moot/Ranger Meet and their Crew/Team has been awarded at least three standards in the immediately preceding four years..
- (iv) A Weightage of 2% marks of the total aggregate of marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to the Scouts/ Guides/Rover Scouts/ Ranger Guides of the following categories:
- (a) Those who have been awarded Ramblers Badge/ Disaster Management Badge/Community Worker Badge/Rural worker Badge and Certificate in the immediately preceding four years.
- (b) Those who have participated in District/ Divisional/ State level scout camp/and other competitions in the immediately preceding three years.
- (c) Those who have attended an Adventure Camp at the National/ State level in the immediately preceding three years.
- (d) Those who have attended the Rover Mate/ Ranger Mate training camp at the State level in the immediately preceding three years.
- (e) Those who have rendered 240 hours Community Social Service in the immediately preceding two years.
- (f) Those who have contributed at least 50% individually in getting the Prime Minister's Shield/uprashtrapati shield Certificate in the immediately preceding two years.
- (g) Those who have attended Rover/ Ranger Training Camp at the Divisional/State level in the immediately preceding four years.
- (h) Those who have contributed at least 50% individuality in achieving Standard of Fourteen point Programme of the Rajasthan State Bharat Scouts & Guides in the immediately preceding two years.
- (v) A weightage of 1% marks of the total aggregate of the marks prescribed for the qualifying examination will be given to the Scouts/ Guides/ Rover Scouts/ Ranger Guides of the following categories:
- (a) Those who have been awarded Tritiya Sopan/Praveen Certificate duly countersigned by by the Assistant Organising Commissioner/ State Organizing Commissioner.
- (b) Those who have rendered 120 hours Community Social service in the immediately preceding one year.

Mountaineering

The following weightage of marks shall be given to the candidates who have taken part in Mountaineering:

- (i) Basic Course in Mountaineering 1% organised by University/Recognised Institutes
- (ii) Advanced Course in Mountaineering 2% organised by University Recognised Institutes
- (iii) Adventure Programmes organised by 3% University or the Ministry of Education and reached 20,000 ft. height or above
- (iv) National Representation in International 5% Expeditions

Note : Subject to the provision of clauses B and F above:

Defence Personnel

- (1) The wards of such defence personnel of state domicile who are killed in action shall be admitted irrespective of merit provided they fulfil the eligibility conditions laid down for the course. The seats shall be limited to 3% of total seats on supernumerary basis.

Concessions for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants

The following concession shall be admissible to the wards of Kashmiri Migrants as per direction of Government of India.

- (i) Relaxation in cut-off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement;
- (ii) Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise;
- (iii) Reservation of atleast one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions;
- (iv) Waiving of domicile requirements;

Concessions for the Son/Daughter / Grandson / Grand-daughter of Freedom fighter

Reservation will be made only as per government policy (i.e. S.C.-16%, S.T. 12%, OBC 21% and PH 5%, MBC 5% & EWS 10% in each category).

Ordinance 168-A

O.168-A. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Ordinances, a candidate shall in **no case be permitted to appear at two main examinations** of the University simultaneously in the same year.

N.B.: This will not apply to the examination for Diploma in Indian Culture and Certificate/Diploma in Modern European Languages/Sanskrit/ Persian/ Steno-Typing/Certificate in Spoken English/ Certificate Course in Dramatics/Certificate Course in Computer Application / Diploma in Journalism / Tourism and Hotel Management.

Important Instructions

★ **Ragging is strictly prohibited in the University Campus/Constituent Colleges and outside University Campus. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be first given opportunity to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution as per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court. (Each admitted student has to submit an affidavit that he/she will not be involved in any activity related to ragging)**

★ Candidates are advised to acquaint themselves with the University Statutes/ Ordinances/ Rules/Regulations/ Syllabi (Syllabi are available on University website <http://www.uniraj.ac.in> and prescribed books as well as with the amendments made therein from time to time which are applicable to their courses.

★ All students admitted to the university are required to always carry their current identity cards duly authenticated by the Unit Head concerned, failing which disciplinary action may be taken against them.

★ Students are advised to read the relevant Ordinances printed by the University.

★ Admission to Ph.D. programme shall be through PAT entrance test to be notified by the University.

RULES FOR ADMISSION

General Rules

1. Admission of a student to a course shall be subject to the conditions prescribed by the relevant University Ordinances/Rules as applicable to the course in which admission is sought.
2. Students shall not be eligible for admission to a course unless they have passed the qualifying examination or any other examination recognized for the purpose and possess such other qualifications (if any) as may be prescribed by the Ordinances.
 - a) Applications for admission to various post-graduate programmes of study in the teaching departments /Constituent colleges of the University shall be submitted online as per notification of admission by the University separately.
 - b) The Schedule and other details of admission for the programmes namely Ph.D, MBA, B.Tech./M.Tech.in CCT, M.Ed., B.A.LLB (Hons.), Five year law shall be notified by University separately.

NO APPLICATION WILL BE ENTERTAINED AFTER LAST DATE GIVEN IN UNIVERSITY NOTIFICATION

3. Submission of online application form does not guarantee admission.
4. **Jurisdiction of Court Cases:** All court cases shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Rajasthan University head quarter sat Jaipur and not any other place.
5. Seats will be reserved for S.C.,S.T.,OBC (except creamy layer), MBC, EWS, Kashmiri Migrants and Differently able applicants as per Government of Rajasthan policy/ as per directions of Hon'ble High Court of Rajasthan.
6. Concession / Weight age in the aggregate of marks at the academic record only is admissible for purposes of admission to the various courses of study as per provisions of O.81III.

7. Admission in UG Programmes will be made on the basis of merit. The merit will be prepared by using first five subject mentioned in the senior secondary marksheet.

8. A student who has secured his/her percentage of marks with out the addition of concession/ weightage marks shall rank higher in order of merit than the one who has secured the same percentage of marks with the addition of the concession/ weightage marks allowed to him/her under the rules. In PG programme candidate has to in appear in entrance Exam. (URATPG).

9. All admissions will be provisional till the applicant completes all the formalities required.

Payment of Fee: No student shall be treated as admitted to a course till he/she has deposited the necessary fees (admission, tuition and others). All fees will be charged for 12 months irrespective of the date of admission. **Fees once paid shall not be refunded except the caution money**

10. The deposited caution money will be refundable only after clearance of dues, if any, when claimed with in three sessions of leaving the College/ Department.

11. **N.T.S. Applicants:** National Talent Scholars (selected by the N.C.E.R.T.) may be admitted *outright* provided they fulfill the minimum eligibility conditions. Only such NTS candidates shall get admission who are eligible to draw the scholarship. However NTS applicants are required to appear in entrance test.

12. Admission of Candidates with a Supplementary:

(i) An applicant who is declared eligible to appear at the Supplementary Examination will have to appear in URATPG 2025 examination for seeking admission to PG programmes.

(ii) The applicant will be provisionally admitted, at his / her own risk, to the PG programme by the last day fixed for admission subject to the conditions mentioned in the clause given below. He/she will be assumed to have secured minimum pass marks in the subject of supplementary examination for the purpose of preparation of merit list for admission.

(iii) A candidate who fails or absents him/her

self at the Supplementary Examination shall have no right to continue in the admitted PG programme and his/her provisional admission shall stand automatically cancelled.

13. Admission of candidates on declaration of Revaluation Results and disposal of cases of Unfair Means:

Admission of candidates who becomes eligible for admission to PG programmes as a result of revaluation, will have to submit their revised result before the last day fixed for admission, subject to availability of Provided he/ she has appeared in URATPG-2025 Examination.

14. Admission of in-service Candidates: In-service candidates may be allowed admission to the various courses under the Faculties of Arts, Law, Science and Commerce on production of a '**No Objection-Cum-Character Certificate**' from their employers, without which their applications will not be considered. 'In-service candidates' refers to employees of Central or State Government, Statutory bodies, Govt. Controlled Under takings, Banks and employees of Govt. recognised and aided colleges, institutions and registered firms. **But such students are also required to appear in URATPG 2025 Entrance test**

15. Admission of Candidates from other Universities: A student migrating from a University shall not be admitted to any year of the course other than the first except as other wise provided for in the University Ordinances and such a student shall be required, by the concerned Head, to obtain an '**Eligibility Certificate**' from the University. Application for such a certificate accompanied by a fee of Rs. 90/- and necessary qualifying certificate shall be made to the Registrar through the Head of the concerned department to which he/she is seeking admission on the printed form.

16. Special rules for admission of International Students are given separately in this prospectus.

17. Non-eligibility: The following categories of students **shall not be eligible** for admission:

- (a) Candidates who are declared failed;
- (b) Candidates who are detained from appearing at an examination on account of shortage of attendance;
- (c) Candidates who did not appear in an examination after filling the examination form and thereby could not pass a class;
- (d) Candidates who were notified as unauthorized occupants of any accommodation in any of the University Hostel by the Chief Warden/Warden concerned in the immediately preceding year.

However, a candidate belonging to categories (a) or (b) or (c) above may be admitted to the same class once again if he/she has participated in the Inter-Collegiate Tournaments of the University or Inter-University/Inter-State/ International Tournaments/ championships during the immediately preceding year and in the case of Inter-Collegiate Tournaments the candidate himself or his/her team should have figured in the first three positions in the tournament. Such a candidate will not be re-admitted to the same class more than once.

- (e) (i) Any candidate against whom an F.I.R. has been lodged by the University or any of the Constituent Colleges or any Affiliated College or by any other competent Authority/ Officer of the University/ College shall not be eligible for admission as a regular candidate in any of the Departments of the University/Constituent Colleges/ Affiliated Colleges/ Institutions;
- (ii) Any person who has been convicted of criminal offence involving moral turpitude shall not be eligible for admission as a regular student in any of the Departments of the University/ Constituent Colleges/ Affiliated Colleges/ Institutions; and
- (iii) Any candidate who has been found guilty in any misbehaviour with any teacher or with any authority/official of the University shall be debarred from seeking admission in any of the Departments of the University/ Constituent Colleges/ Affiliated Colleges / Institutions.
18. No course in SFS can be run if the number of admitted candidates is less than the recommendations of SFS Committee.

Semester/Credits:

- A semester comprises 90 working days and an academic year is divided into two semesters.
- A summer term is for eight weeks during summer vacation. Internship/apprenticeship /work-based vocational education and year 7 or 6 training can be carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study ordinance of UG.

Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible for admission to the undergraduate program, candidates must fulfil the following criteria:

1. Educational Qualifications: Candidates must have completed their higher secondary education (12 years of schooling) or an equivalent examination from a recognized board or institution.
2. Minimum Marks: Candidates must have obtained the minimum required marks or grades in the qualifying examination as specified by the university and the respective program of study.
3. Subject Requirements: Depending on the chosen program, candidates may be required to have studied specific subjects in their qualifying examination.

Duration of the Programme:

- i. The duration of the UG programme is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. If a student wants to leave after the completion of the first (2 semester) or second year (4 semester), the student will be given a UG Certificate or UG Diploma, respectively, provided they secure the prescribed number of credits (as given in Table 1). Students who exit with a UG certificate or UG diploma are permitted to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme.
- ii. Students may be permitted to take a break

from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

Major and Minor disciplines:

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline

Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, Value Added and Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Courses:

Ability Enhancement Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses:

To supplement the core curriculum, a range of Ability Enhancement and Skill Enhancement Courses are offered by the University in accordance with UGC guidelines.

The aim of ability enhancement courses (AEC) is to develop competency in both Hindi and English language. These courses focus on critical reading, expository and academic writing skills, and the recognition of language as a mediator of knowledge and identity. Additionally, they provide cultural and intellectual insights into the chosen MIL and English language and emphasize the development of communication skills, including participation in discussions and debates.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) aim to develop students' domain-specific skills, enhance their employability, and foster a spirit of entrepreneurship. The specific courses offered (As approved by the CoC of SEC) may vary from year to year and will be notified on the university website, ensuring that students have access to the latest and most relevant knowledge and skills.

Value-Added Courses:

In order to emphasize the importance of holistic development and the nurturing of well-rounded individuals, the university offers value-added courses alongside the academic curriculum. These courses provide students with additional skills and experiences. They include Understanding India, Environmental science/education, Courses in cutting-edge areas, Courses related to Health & Wellness, Yoga education, and engagement in activities such as the National Cadet Corps (NCC), National Service Scheme (NSS), social work, Anandam Program, and sports. Participation in these activities fosters personal growth, leadership qualities, teamwork, discipline, and a sense of social responsibility. The specific courses offered may vary each year and will be communicated through the university's website, as approved by the Committee of Courses for Value-Added Courses.

Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Courses:

The University's undergraduate program includes introductory-level courses that aim to broaden students' intellectual experience and contribute to a liberal arts and science education. These courses are mandatory for all undergraduate students and cover various broad disciplines. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses that they have already taken at the higher secondary level and as major/minor discipline.

The broad disciplines for the introductory-level courses are as follows:

- i. **Natural and Physical Sciences:** Students can choose basic courses from disciplines such as Biology, Botany, Zoology, Biotechnology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Physics, Biophysics, Astronomy and Astrophysics, Earth and Environmental Sciences, and more.
- ii. **Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications:** These courses provide students with tools and techniques applicable to their major and minor disciplines. The courses may involve training in programming software like Python and applications software like STATA, SPSS, Tally, etc. These courses are beneficial for data analysis and the application of quantitative tools in science and social science.
- iii. **Library, Information, and Media Sciences:** Courses in this category focus on recent developments in information and media science, including journalism, mass media, and communication.
- iv. **Commerce and Management:** These courses cover areas such as business management, accountancy, finance, financial institutions, fintech, and more.
- v. **Humanities and Social Sciences:** This category includes courses related to Social Sciences, such as Anthropology, Communication and Media, Economics, History, Linguistics, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology, and more. These courses help students understand individuals, social behaviour, society, and the nation. The humanities courses cover subjects like Archaeology, History, Comparative Literature, Arts & Creative expressions, Creative Writing and Literature, language(s), Philosophy, and interdisciplinary courses. Interdisciplinary subjects like Cognitive Science, Environmental Science, Gender Studies, Global Environment & Health, International Relations, Political Economy and Development, Sustainable Development, Women's and Gender Studies, etc., provide insights into society.

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degrees

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 48 credits will be awarded a (2 semester) UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one internship of 4 credits during the summer vacation

of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 96 credits will be awarded the (4 semester) UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one internship of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year/second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree (6 semester) in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 150 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in Table 1.

4-year (8 semester) UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 200 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in Table 1.

4-year (8 semester) UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 200 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

Minimum Credit Requirement:

To ensure a comprehensive development of our students, the University of Rajasthan has established a minimum credit requirement for the successful completion of the Three/four-year undergraduate program. This requirement ensures that students obtain the necessary depth and breadth of knowledge across core and elective courses, enabling them to acquire a well-rounded education.

Exit and Entrance Policy

1. Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 48 credits will be awarded a **UG Certificate**, in addition, they complete one internship of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
2. Students who have secured 96 credits and opt to exit after completion of the second year, will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one internship of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.
3. Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semester) UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 150 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.
4. A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 200 credits and have satisfied the minimum credit requirements.
5. Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline. The students who secure 200 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

Under Graduate Programme Framework:

UG curriculum is meticulously crafted in accordance with the UGC curriculum and credit framework, guaranteeing academic rigour, quality, and alignment with national standards. The UGC guidelines for the four-year undergraduate program serve as the foundation of our curriculum, ensuring that our students receive an education of the highest standards and relevance. (Table-

2) Pedagogical Approaches:

University employs a range of pedagogical approaches to promote active learning, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills among our

students. Our esteemed faculty members utilize innovative teaching methodologies such as lectures, seminars, group discussions, case studies, workshops, and experiential learning activities. These approaches foster student engagement, collaboration, and the practical application of knowledge, ensuring that students are well-prepared to meet the challenges of the modern world.

Learning Assessment:

We believe in continuous assessment to gauge students' progress and provide constructive feedback for their academic growth. Our assessment methods include regular assignments, quizzes, examinations, presentations, projects, and research papers. These assessments not only evaluate students' understanding of the subject matter but also assess their analytical thinking, communication skills, and ability to apply knowledge to real-world scenarios.

Continuous assessment, in which sessional work and the terminal examination will contribute to the final grade. Each course in Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) has two components- Continuous assessment (20% weightage) and (End of Semester Examination) EoSE (80% weightage).

1. Sessional work will consist of class tests, mid-semester examination(s), homework assignments, etc., as determined by the faculty in charge of the courses of study.
2. Each Paper of EoSE shall carry 80% of the total marks of the course/subject. The EoSE will be of 3 hours duration.
 - Part-A of the paper shall have multiple questions of equal marks. This first question shall be based on knowledge, understanding and applications of the topics/texts covered in the syllabus.
 - Part B of the paper shall consist of 4 questions with an internal choice of each. The four questions will be set with one from each of the units with internal choice. Third to fourth questions shall be based on applications of the topics/texts covered in the syllabus (60 % weightage) and shall involve solving Problems (40% weightage) if applicable.
3. 75% Attendance is mandatory for appearing in EoSE.
4. To appear in the EoSE examination of a course/subject student must appear in the mid-semester examination and obtain at least a C grade in the course/subject.
5. Credit points in a Course/Subject will be assigned only if, the student obtains at least a C grade in midterm and EoSE examination of a Course/Subject.

6. 1 credit = 25 marks for examination/evaluation

Letter Grades and Grade Points:

To ensure a fair and transparent evaluation system, we follow the letter grades and grade points system as per the UGC guidelines. Each course is assigned a letter grade based on the student's performance, which is then converted into grade points. The letter grades and grade points provide a comprehensive assessment of student's academic achievements and are reflected in their transcripts.

When students take audit courses, they may be given a pass (P) or fail (F) grade without any credits.

Computation of SGPA and CGPA:

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) are calculated to measure students' overall performance. The SGPA is computed for each semester by taking the weighted average of the grade points earned in that particular semester, while the CGPA is calculated by considering the weighted average of grade points across all semesters. These indicators provide a comprehensive view of student's academic progress throughout their undergraduate journey.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

- i. The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.

$$\text{SGPA} (S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

- ii. The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

Note

1. Marks obtained in each course and a weighted average of marks based on marks obtained in all semesters taken together shall be mentioned in the mark sheet.
2. The Letter grades, Grade Points and SGPA and CGPA shall be issued in the transcript for each semester and a consolidated transcript indicating the performance in all semesters.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) shall support Multiple Entry and Exit System (MEES) to promote flexibility in curriculum ensuring mobility of learners across the universities of their choice.

The students shall also get an option to gain the credits by learning quality massive open online Courses (MOOCs) from UGC approved digital

platforms such as Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM). This national-level credit account will facilitate the digital storage of earned credits from different HEIs and the certificate/ diploma/ degree shall be awarded in line with the accumulated credits in a specific duration at the Undergraduate and Master's levels.

After registration in the national ABC framework, Multiple Entry System for smooth execution of multidisciplinary and flexible learning with impeccable credit count, credit transfer and credit acceptance from students' account shall be implemented.

Internship

A minimum of 120 hours (equivalent to 4 credits) is mandatory for the internship component out of the required minimum 150/200 credits of a 3-year UG degree / 4-year UG degree (Honours) / 4-year UG degree (Honours with Research). This 120-hour (4-credit) internship must be undertaken after the 4th semester by all students enrolled in undergraduate degree programmes in the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Fine Arts, Science and Social Science. Further if a student opts to exit the programme after the 2nd or 4th semester, completion of a 120-hour (4-credit) internship is compulsory for the award of a Certificate or Diploma in the respective discipline.

For internship credit calculation: One credit is equivalent to two hours of engagement per week. Therefore, over a 15-week semester, one credit corresponds to 30 hours of internship work.

General Rules for U.G. Admission

1. Non-Rajasthan Applicants: Not more than 10% students shall be admitted from institutions outside Rajasthan. Such candidates should have secured a First Division (60%) and should be otherwise eligible. However, the condition of obtaining a First Division may be relaxed in the case of:

- (i) Female candidates migrating to Rajasthan on account of their marriage to a resident of Rajasthan.
- (ii) Male candidates, who after passing the qualifying examination from any other University, have passed a three-year course from this University, and
- (iii) Son/ Daughter of a serving employee of the Central Government or a Public Sector Organization posted in Rajasthan. They will be considered for admission on the basis of merit *at par* with candidates from Rajasthan.

2. Non-Rajasthan students securing a second division from other states may also be considered subject to the availability of seats after all the eligible students

from Rajasthan and First Division holders from other States have been accommodated. The rule of minimum percentage wherever applicable, will however, be followed.

3. There is no gap period limit for all candidates as per the rules of Govt. of Rajasthan.
4. 5% marks will be deducted in case of faculty change students seeking admission from Science to Art/ Commerce, Commerce to Art and to Fine Arts Faculty. This will be done while preparing the merit list so as to benefit students of the same faculty.
5. While preparing the merit list 5% marks will be deducted of those vocational courses students who have passed their senior secondary exam and are desirous to seek admission to the first year of B.A. and B.Com Course.
6. Students who have failed in one faculty can change their faculty on the basis of their qualifying exams provided their general conduct and practice have been satisfactory. Such student will be considered as new entrant Faculty change is allowed only once.
7. **Admission of Non-Collegiate Candidates:** A candidate passing the First Year/Second Year/ Part I/ Part II Examination of a course of study as a non-collegiate candidate (wherever permitted) shall not be eligible for admission to the next higher class in a college. However, a candidate passing the previous examination of a course of study as a non-collegiate candidate may be considered for admission to the next higher class of the same course of study if seats are available, provided.
 - (i) A candidate who secures a minimum of 50% marks (**without any weightage**) in the case of Faculties of Arts, Fine Arts and Social Sciences, and 55% marks in the case of Faculties of Science and Commerce in the aggregate at the First Year /Part I Examination of the University or an examination recognised by the University as equivalent there to shall be eligible for admission as a regular student to the next higher class of the same course of study.
 - (ii) A candidate who has passed the First Year/ Part I Examination as a regular student and the Second Year/Part II Examination as a non-collegiate candidate shall also be eligible to take admission to the Final Year/Part III class of the same course as a regular student if he/she has obtained a minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate at the Second Year/Part II Examination.

N.B.: The expression "Non-Collegiate candidates excludes ex-students O. 81-1 (iii).

For admission to post graduate programmes, the candidates will be required to submit the online Application Form for University of Rajasthan Admission Test for Post Graduate Courses 2025 (URATPG-2025) for which a separate notification will be published by the University.

ABOUT UNIVERSITY OF RAJASTHAN ADMISSION TEST FOR POSTGRADUATE COURSES (URATPG-2025)

- (i) Admission to the PG Departments (except a few) of the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur shall be made on the basis of Entrance Test and Academic Merit of the qualifying Examination. However, admissions in all the PG Programmes being run under the faculty of Law shall be made on the basis of marks scored by the candidates in URATPG 2025 examination only.
- (ii) Admission to different streams of Faculty of Fine Arts (except MPA, Music, MVA) will be given on the basis of marks obtained (70% weight age) in the Test URATPG 2025 + 30% (Marks in qualifying exam) + 30 Marks in the Practical Exam wherever applicable (to be conducted by the Department).
- (iii) The process of URATPG 2025 shall be carried out in the following two steps:

FIRST PHASE:

- (i) The Candidate is required to go to the University website <http://uratpg.uniraj.edu.in> for further details regarding application and Admission form submission.
- (ii) The candidate can apply for appearing in the Entrance Test for a maximum of 3 (three) test subjects in a single form.
- (iii) Requisite fee will be paid online through payment gateway.

- (vii) **Only appearing in the University of Rajasthan Entrance Test (URATPG-2025) will not ensure admission to a programme of study in the University. Each candidate shall ensure that he/she fulfills the Eligibility Criteria and that the particulars furnished in the Admission Form are complete and correct in all the respect. In case, it is detected at any stage that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility criteria and/or has furnished incorrect information or suppressed any material/information, his/her candidature will be cancelled and if already admitted, shall be liable to be forfeited the benefits accrued thereon, besides rustication from the University.**
- (viii) In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she may be expelled from the institution. However, if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given opportunity to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the Institution.
- (ix) **NO SEPARATE INTIMATION REGARDING SELECTION TO A PROGRAMME OF STUDY SHALL BE SENT TO THE APPLICANT. THE CANDIDATES ARE DIRECTED TO REMAIN IN TOUCH WITH THE CONCERNED DEPARTMENT AND WATCH THE NOTICEBOARD OF THE CONCERNED DEPARTMENT AND UNIVERSITY ADMISSION WEBSITE (www.uniraj.ac.in) FOR DAY TO DAY UPDATES.**

ENTRANCE TEST DETAILS

- (i) The entrance test shall have 100 objective type questions carry ingone (1) mark each for each subject/ programme within the notified syllabus(which is available on the website of the University for all undergraduate subjects/ programme) The duration for each paper shall be 2 hours.
- (ii) Examination Centres: The Centre for Entrance Test(URATPG-2025) and Roll number will be given on admission card which can be downloaded from the University website. The candidate will be required to fix a self-attested recent photograph and will have to produce valid Government ID proof in the examination hall.
- (iii) The Time Schedule of Entrance Test will be notified on

the University website separately.

- (iv) The sample question papers of the past year URATPG examination will be available on the University website www.uniraj.ac.in
- (v) Totally blind candidates must arrange amanuensis on their own and should carry attested copies of the certificate issued in accordance with Statute 17 (A) (ii). Moreover attested copies of Marks Card/Certificate and Photo Identity of amanuensis who should not possess higher qualification than 10+2, be also submitted to the Superintendent of the Entrance Test Centre.
- (vi) The candidates will not be allowed to enter in the Examination Hall after ten minutes of the commencement of the Examination.
- (vii) After completion of entrance test, the candidates can carry Question Booklet with them.
- (viii) **Publication of Answer Key:** The University shall publish the Answer Key pertaining to URATPG-2025 on the University website in the evening of the examination day. Candidates having any doubt with reference to Answer Key/Questions in the URATPG-2025 can communicate the same to the Office of the Convener URATPG-2025 within two days after publication of Answer key.

Second Phase

- (i) After declaration of URATPG-2025 Entrance Test Result, the candidate will be required to generate Admission form for related Programmes of the Test Subject from University Website <https://uratpg.uniraj.edu.in> by paying requisite fee.
- (ii) **After depositing requisite fee Rs. 165 online through payment Gateway** the candidate will be redirected to fill application form for a particular programme.
- (iii) The candidate can offer a maximum of 5 (Five) programmes either of one faculty or in more than one faculty. These programmes would be available within the scope of the subjects in which candidate appeared in the entrance test. **IF A CANDIDATE EITHER DOES NOT CHOOSE A TEST SUBJECT OR REMAINS ABSENT IN CHOSEN TEST SUBJECT THEN THE CANDIDATE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CHOOSE SUCH SUBJECT RELATED PROGRAMMES.**
- (iv) The candidate has to submit the Hard copy of these forms in the Programme related Department/Centre on or before the prescribed date of submission of the Hard Copy.
- (v) The candidate has to submit the self-attested copies of the following Certificates/Documents along with hard copy of the online generated application form:
 - a) Secondary School Marks Sheet
 - b) Senior Secondary School Marks Sheet
 - c) Undergraduate Marks Sheet
 - d) Valid Caste Certificate of **SC/ST/OBC/MBC/EWC**(if applicable)
 - e) Certificate/document to claim weightage (**PH/Sports/NSS/NCC/Others**), if any.
 - f) Any other document which the candidate thinks appropriate.

- g) Original Challan for each programme as application fee.
- (vi) Head of the Department/Director of the Centre will constitute an Admission Committee to prepare the merit list, **based on URATPG-2025 test scores (70% weightage) and 30% weightage of the academic performance of the qualifying examination and weightage for other activities (if applicable) as given in the Prospectus.** The concerning Head of the Department will display the list of the eligible candidates seeking admission to the program based on the merit. The decision of the concerned HOD relating to grant of admission will be final. Reservation policy of the University will be followed, while preparing the merit in the Departments.
- (vii) **The candidate belonging to Outright Category (O) shall be required to appear in the URATPG-2025.**

Students' Entitlement

Guidelines for Students' Entitlement as per UGC Letter D.O. No.14-32/2011(CPP-II) Dated 25-04-2013

The guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) in order to help students, teachers, administrators and institutions understand what the minimum entitlements of the students are:-

1. Admission

- 1.1. An announcement or advertisement for any course of study must clearly specify whether the degree granted is notified by the UGC and other relevant statutory authorities [Under Section 22 c of the UGC Act, latest list available at the UGC website] and whether the university that awards the degree figures in the list of universities maintained by the UGC [available at the UGC website].
- 1.2. A student seeking admission is entitled to a document (usually called 'Prospectus') that specifies the curricula including syllabi, names and academic profile and status of the faculty, mode and frequency of evaluation, duration of the course, academic calendar, comprehensive information about fees or charges of any kind, and refund rules. The information given in the prospectus should not be changed to the disadvantage of the student during the course of study; any change if necessary must be communicated to each student individually spelling out reasons for such a change.
- 1.3. The Prospectus must spell out exactly the process and criteria for admissions. This includes weightage given to previous academic performance, entrance examination and interview.

The syllabi and format of the entrance examination must be spelt out. The final scores of each candidate who appeared for entrance examination including all the components and the entire waiting list must be made public.

- 1.4. Information about any reservations or quota for any category, the eligibility criteria for these reservations/quotas, certificate required for seeking admission under these must be stated clearly in the Prospectus.
- 1.5. The student must not be asked to produce documents which have not been mentioned in the Prospectus. While the institution can ask the student to produce the original documents (such as School Leaving Certificate, Marksheet, Caste certificate) for verification, they cannot retain any original documents of any students. [As notified by UGC on 23rd April 2007, F. No. 1-3/2007 (CPP II)]

2. Quality of Teaching and Learning

- 2.1. It is the responsibility of the college/university to help the students develop their learning skills by facilitating the creation of learner centric environment conducive for quality education. The students are entitled to receiving instruction and reading material in all the languages allowed by the institution as medium of instruction or examination.
- 2.2. The students who begin with a difficulty due to social handicap or a shift in the medium of instruction are entitled to special support to bridge the gap.
- 2.3. The students are entitled to availability and presence of qualified teacher, fulfillment of the specified number of teaching days and contact hours for each course and completion of syllabus on time. [UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualification of Teachers... 2010]
- 2.4. The students are entitled to reasonable access to facilities, services and resources including library (that stocks textbooks, reference books, journals, e-resources), laboratories, and ICT facilities in the languages permitted as medium of instruction or examination.
- 2.5. The student are entitled to fair, transparent and timely evaluation, including fair provisions for timely re-checking or re-evaluation of the scripts and redressal of any grievance related to the evaluation process. The students are entitled to a copy of their answer scripts after the declaration of results.
- 2.6. The students are entitled to timely conduct of examination and declaration of results as specified in the academic calendar in the Prospectus. They shall be entitled to the award of degree within 180 days of the declaration of results.
- 2.7. The students are entitled to give regular feedback on the quality of teaching, students services and institutional infrastructure. The college/university shall establish mechanisms for seeking this feedback regularly and

taking student feedback into account for review and improvement.

3. Fee and Financial Aid

- 3.1. The students are entitled to prior and full information about amount, components, frequency and mode of any kind of payment including fees or charges of any other kind and refund rules. If a student withdraws before the beginning of the course, the student should be refunded the entire fee given to it with a maximum deduction of Rs. 1000. [As notified by UGC on 23rd April 2007, F. No. 1-3/2007 (CPP II)]
- 3.2. A college/university will make utmost effort to ensure that no student is deprived of opportunities of quality education for lack of sufficient financial resources. It is the responsibility of the policy makers to ensure that sufficient funds are made available to implement this principle. The Prospectus shall contain consolidated information about scholarship/fellowship/financial aid scheme of any type that that is available to the students. It shall bring to notice and assist the students in accessing such schemes. It shall ensure that the procedure for selection is fair and transparent.

4. Infrastructure

- 4.1. The students are entitled to access to appropriate resources including classrooms, libraries, laboratories and other academic facilities necessary for quality education. [UGC rules and regulations for fitness of universities and colleges for Grants under section 12 B of the UGC Act 1956, Private University Regulation, Deemed University Regulation].
- 4.2. The students are entitled to reasonable access to sports and recreation facilities, avenues for literary, aesthetic and other extra-curricular pursuits.
- 4.3. The student are entitled to reasonable attention to medical and health requirements including free and periodic health check-up and treatment/ hospitalization in case of medical emergencies.
- 4.4. The students are entitled to a reasonable access to adequate, clean and hygienic hostel/residence accommodation that provides basic amenities including recreational facilities. Such accommodation should be affordable and must not be utilized by the institution for profit making. Accommodation meant for students must not be encroached upon by the institution for any other purpose.
- 4.5. Student with disability are entitled to access to all schemes, facilities and services in the university without discrimination. The college/university shall strive towards a universal design of learning based curriculum that can address the needs of the broadest possible range of students by minimizing barriers and maximizing learning for all students. The college/university shall provide barrier free access, special library resources (including Braille and ICT

resources], provisions for sign language interpreter/transcriber, the required equipments and electronic resources and the required relaxation in examination to all students with disability. [Person with Disabilities (Equal Opportunity, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995; UGC D.O.No.F-6-1/2006(CPPII), F.No.6-1/2012(SCT)]

5. The students are entitled to non-discriminatory treatment (in the sense of absence of harassment, victimization or exclusion) in every aspect of institutional functioning. Any discrimination based on caste, gender, creed, colour, race, religion, place of birth, political conviction, language and disability shall be prohibited.

5.1. In particular, institutions shall not discriminate against students belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes and racial profiling of students from any region or ethnic group. [UGC (Promotion of Equity in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2012]

5.2. The students are entitled to protection from sexual harassment by complaining to the Gender Sensitization Committees against Sexual Harassment. It is mandatory for each college/university to constitute and publicize this committee as per the Guidelines and norms laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court [Vishaka and Others Vs. State of Rajasthan and Others (JT 1997 (7) SC 384)]

5.3. All students are entitled to protection from ragging in any form [UGC (Curbing the Menace of Ragging) Regulation, 2009]

6. As democratic citizens, the students are entitled to freedom of thought and expression within and outside their institution. The college/university must allow space for free exchange of ideas and public debate so as to foster a culture of critical

reasoning and questioning. College/university authorities must not impose unreasonable, partisan or arbitrary restrictions on organizing seminars, lecture and debates that do not otherwise violate any law.

7. The students are entitled to forming associations and unions, directly electing their representatives to Students Unions and having their representatives on the college/university decision making bodies including internal quality assessment, grievance committees, Gender Sensitization Committees against Sexual Harassment and the Academic/Executive council. University/colleges shall evolve mechanisms for adequate consultations with students' representatives before taking any major decision affecting the students.

8. The students are entitled to full and correct information about any institution of higher education in which they study or propose to study. Therefore, every college/university must disclose the following information on its website and Prospectus: status of the institution, its affiliation, accreditation rating, physical assets and amenities, membership of governing bodies and minutes of the meetings of bodies like Academic/Executive council, sources of income and the financial situation and any other information about its functioning necessary for a student to make a fully informed choice. [Section 4 (1) of Right to Information Act 2005].

9. The students are entitled to redressal of their grievance by the Grievance Redressal Committee of the institution within 10 days of making a representation. If they are not satisfied, they are also entitled to an appeal to the Ombudsman of the University concerned for redressal within 30 days. [UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2012]

10. The UGC may issue instructions for proper implementation of these Guidelines.





In celebration of *World Heritage Week*, in collaboration with Jaipur Virasat Foundation, the Department conducted a two-day Heritage Walk on 17th and 18th November 2024. An international workshop on *Pre-historic Lithic Tools* was organized on 11th -13th November 2024 in which archaeologists from Korea and Prof Parth R Chauhan from IISER Mohali trained the students in practical aspects of toolmaking. The department has been the nursery of Vice Chancellors and great administrators. Prof. Iqbal Narain had been the Member Secretary, ICSSR and the V.C. of NEHU, B.H.U and Univ. of Rajasthan. Prof. V.R. Mehta had been the V.C. of Kota Open Univ., JNV Univ., Jodhpur and Delhi Univ., Delhi. Prof. K.L. Kamal had been the V.C. of Univ. of Rajasthan. Prof. Naresh Dadhich was the V.C. of Vardhman Mahaveer Open Univ., Kota for two term (2006- 2013). Prof. B.M. Sharma was the V.C. of Kota Univ and the Chairperson of Rajasthan Public Service Commission. Prof. Roop Singh Bareth was the V.C. of M.D.S. Univ., Ajmer. Prof. L.K. Jain was the Chairperson of Rajasthan State Commission for Women. The department has contributed immensely to the growth of the discipline. Many of the pioneer courses like Modern Political Theory, Comparative Government and Institutions and State Politics were formulated here and were later adopted in other Universities. New Course on Contemporary Political Theory was also introduced. Empirical Research with appropriate research methodologies was initiated and strengthened by Prof. S.P. Verma and Prof. Iqbal Narain and carried forward by its faculty and students. Normative and philosophical research was equally strong. A tree plantation campaign was organized by the NITI Aayog Chair, Rajasthan University, Jaipur on 30th September 2024 under the campaign "एक पेड़ मां के नाम" (One tree in the name of mother) in memory of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi.

Currently, work is underway on proposed project for evaluating the role of MSME in Rajasthan. This analysis will lead to identification of bottlenecks and suggest future strategy to open more opportunity in MSME sector in Rajasthan to achieve goal of "Viksit Bharat Viksit Rajasthan @2047".

अपनी स्थापना के बाद से, केंद्र ने स्रोत सामग्री एकत्र करने, सूचीबद्ध करने और प्रकाशित करने तथा क्षेत्र के इतिहास, संस्कृति, समाज, राजस्थानी साहित्य अर्थव्यवस्था और पर्यावरण से संबंधित विभिन्न विषयों पर संगोष्ठियों के आयोजनों एवं संबंधित शोध परियोजनाओं के माध्यम से राजस्थान के इतिहास के कई पहलुओं पर ज्ञान सृजन की दिशा में एक महत्वपूर्ण योगदान दिया है। केंद्र ने अब तक राजस्थान के विभिन्न विषयों पर 15 राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों का आयोजन किया है। केंद्र ने "दक्षिण एशिया में संस्कृति, कला और सामाजिक-राजनीतिक आंदोलनरु तुलनात्मक परिप्रेक्ष्य" पर ६-१८ (भारतीय तुलनात्मक साहित्य संघ) अंतर्राष्ट्रीय सम्मेलन की भी मेजबानी की। साहित्य अकादमी, दिल्ली के सहयोग से तीन दिवसीय राजस्थानी कविता उत्सव का भी आयोजन किया।

यह अध्ययन केंद्र एक अच्छे शोध पुस्तकालय के लिए प्रसिद्ध है, जिसमें लगभग 5600 पुस्तकें और ठिकानों के अभिलेखों का एक मूल्यवान संग्रह है। इस पुस्तकालय का उपयोग भारतीय और विदेशी छात्रों और इतिहास, संस्कृति, पुरातत्त्व, नृविज्ञान, समाजशास्त्र, साहित्य और अन्य विषयों के विद्वानों द्वारा व्यापक रूप से किया जाता है। स्वर्गीय प्रोफेसर जी. एन. शर्मा जी के प्रेरक प्रयासों के परिणामस्वरूप, केंद्र में उनके सहयोग से राजस्थान के इतिहास और संस्कृति पर 1417 दुर्लभ पुस्तकों का खजाना उपहार के रूप में प्राप्त हुआ।

The Rajasthan University Library building is located near the main gate of the University. It has a sitting capacity of about 750 students. It has a collection of more than 5.10 lac books and bound periodicals, etc. The Library subscribes to current journals in physical form relating to various subjects. In addition, about 13000+ e-journals are available for online access under the ONOS and e-Shodh Sindhu Consortium. LMS, Web-OPAC, and RFID systems have been installed for in-house operations of the Rajasthan University Library.

A new building named Dr. B R Ambedkar Library has been constructed as an extension of the Rajasthan University Library with financial assistance from UGC under the UPE grant. This building will be soon made operational.

In addition to book lending, the Library provides the following services:

- Braille Section for visually impaired persons

UGC-MALVIYA MISSION TEACHERS TRAINING CENTRE (UGC-MMTTC)

The UGC– MALVIYA MISSION TEACHERS TRAINING CENTRE (earlier known as Human Resource Development Centre) of University of Rajasthan, Jaipur was established on May 11, 1988 under UGC's scheme for setting up Academic Staff Colleges (ASCs) in universities across India in the wake of National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986. It was ranked as the second-best performer amongst 66 HRDCs in India in the year 2012 by the NAAC peer review committee.

The Malviya Mission Teachers Training Centre conducts Faculty Induction Programmes / Orientation Programmes (for newly-appointed teachers); Refresher Courses (for in-service teachers); Short Term Courses (on themes of multidisciplinary significance) Summer / Winter Schools / Webinars (on a specific thrust area, open for all teachers). It also has provisions for holding special Programmes like Academic Administrators' Workshops, Principals' Meet, Interaction Programmes for Ph.D. Scholars, Non-Teaching Staff Training Programmes etc. it is conducting 2 NEP orientation and sensitization programmes every month for training faculty members regarding New Education Policy 2020. 937 faculty members have been trained in NEP in three months.

Since its inception to date, the HRDC has organized 379 Refresher Courses, 113 Orientation Programmes, 28 Short Term Courses, 03 Workshops, 3 Summer Schools, 2 Winter Schools and 03 Webinars. A number of Special Programmes held include a Principal's Meet, an Academic Administrator's Workshop, a Workshop on Examination Work for newly established Universities in Rajasthan, and an Interaction Programme for Ph. The centre has three well-equipped AC Seminar Halls with Digital Podium, WIFI, High-Definition Projector with motorized screen and audio-visual aids. There is a state-of-art Computer Lab with latest version Computers and software. The MMTTC computer lab, office and library have internet connectivity and WIFI. The MMTTC Library, with computerised catalogue facility, has a rich collection of 5800 books and a range of regularly subscribed newspapers, magazines as well as reputed journals. The MMTTC has its own Guest House with well furnished 30 twin-bed occupancy rooms. The Guest House, situated behind the new MMTTC building in the University campus near Gandhi circle, has all the basic facilities to make the stay of the participants comfortable. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

1. Ph.D. Programme

The University of Rajasthan offers Doctorate of Philosophy (Ph.D.) programmes in under various faculties and subjects. Admission to Ph.D. programme will be made subject and number of vacant seats in the concern subject/department. An applicant to any of the various Ph. D. programmes must have a minimum requirement of at least 60% marks or a higher second division in Master's Degree or equivalent in the related field. The minimum requirements to apply to these programmes will remain the same as those mentioned in the University Prospectus 2024-25. For further details, please check the DSW link of the University of Rajasthan website.

2. Postgraduate & Undergraduate programs

The University of Rajasthan offers Post-graduate & Undergraduate programmes in various subjects. The minimum criteria for applying for these programmes are the same as those for the Indian students which is mentioned in the University Prospectus 2024-25.

3. Certificate/Diploma/ Post Graduate Diploma

The University also offers various certificates, diplomas and post graduate diplomas programmes. The duration of these programmes is normally one year. The details and criteria's of these programmes are provided in the University Prospectus.

- The applications for Ph.D. programme are open throughout the year. Interested candidates can check the DSW link on the University of Rajasthan website and apply accordingly.
- Applicants can apply for multiple courses but there should be a separate application for each course.
- The programme on which the eligibility is to be relied upon must be from an institute included in the list of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). In case the University/ Board is not included in the said list, the candidate has to obtain and submit an Equivalence Certificate to this effect from the AIU. - All submitted transcripts should be translated in English and to be duly attested, along with the last qualifying examination syllabus. If an applicant is applying from their own country, their transcripts should be attested by the concerned accredited authorized government agency and also duly certified by the Indian Embassy or Consulate. For the applicant applying from India, all attestation must be done by the concerned Embassy/ High Commission or Consulate of the relevant country in India. Applications without the attested documents shall be summarily rejected.
- Applicants must collect their admission letter personally or send their authorized representatives to collect the same from the Office of the International Students' Advisor. The intimation about the admission shall also be sent to the selected candidates through email.
- Admitted students should produce their Students' Visa within one month of completion of admission formalities. The duration of Student's Visa should be the same as the duration of course.
- For students applying for Pre-Ph.D. course work, a research visa of one year will be required to complete the necessary administrative and governmental formalities in regards to their research and such student will be given 3 months to procure the relevant Research visa. Upon the registration of the foreign Ph.D. students, the research visa required will be of 6 years as per the University ordinances. Such students will be given 6 months to procure the relevant Research visa. In case of failure to obtain a visa with in the stipulated period, the admission may be cancelled based on further investigation
- The admission of Foreign Diplomats or Officials interested to study in the University of Rajasthan shall be governed by the prescribed applicable procedures and rules as notified by the Government of India from time to time.
- Upon arrival in India, every foreign student must register themselves with the Foreigner's Registration Office within 14 days from the date of first entry into India as per the prescribed applicable procedure. The failure to register will attract a penalty which is to be paid to the Foreigner's Registration Office. - Once admitted, the NRI students will pay the requisite fees for their admission category throughout the duration of the program even if they may not remain NRIs, i.e., their status changes from NRI to non NRI. The admission of foreign Student will be conformed of deposition of their fee.
- The admission fo foreign students will be confirmed after deposition of their fee.
- The admission of the students under the Self-Financing Programme will be confirmed only after getting clearance from the other Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Education), Government of India, New Delhi or the High Commission/Embassy concerned.
- Foreign students are required to submit medical certificate from the specified authority at Indian

Missions abroad will issue Student Visas at the time of their admission. HIV Test is compulsory for all foreign students seeking admission to various courses in the University of Rajasthan.

16. Foreign student who fails in the examination shall be given one more chance for readmission as a regular student in the same class. This concession

can be claimed by a candidate only once for a particular course of study. Foreign students cannot appear as non-collegiate students.

17. The University shall not accept any admission on transfer basis during the course from any mandatory educational institution.

UNIVERSITY SCIENCE INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE (USIC)

About the Centre:

Instrumentation is an interdisciplinary area which is very important in the academic and industrial spheres in the context of national development. The UGC along with many other organizations of Govt. of India have recognized this and launched comprehensive instrumentation programmes. University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC) was established at Univ. of Rajasthan in late 70's with initial support from University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi. The Centre has been set up to support instrumentation facility with the following major objectives: To house high-end research instruments and provide instrumentation facility on specialized instruments to the internal and external faculty/scholars/students as a central facility for carrying out spectral, thermal, chemical and micro structural analysis on a variety of materials are extended to all researchers.

Scientific instruments may be usefully regarded as the capital goods of the scientific research. That is to say, the conduct of scientific research generally requires some antecedent investment in specific equipment for purposes of enhancing the ability to observe and measure specific categories of natural phenomena.

University Science Instrumentation Centre is equipped with very sophisticated and modern research instruments like SQUID, SEM, TEM, GC Mass spectrometer, LC Mass spectrometer, FTIR spectrometer etc. These instruments are dedicated for catering to the need of University Science Departments and other institutes for the research. These machines are used for magnetic and structural characterization of novel materials used in very important areas like Cancer research, Virology, Nano and bio-technology. These are not only used by different research groups of most of the Science departments in our university and other Institutes, but can also be used by industry in future.

National Service Scheme

The cardinal principal of the National Service Scheme is that it is organized by the students themselves and both students and teachers through their combined participation in social service, get a sense of involvement in the tasks of National development. The National Service Scheme covers students at the level of higher education. Thus the administrative structures of the higher education have the responsibility of looking after NSS and its implementation at the university level. The successful functioning of NSS cell at university level will give impetus for proper implementation of NSS in the Unit level.


